Council Highlights
September 12, 2019

- Reviewed the draft municipal website designed by Red Chair Design – the website is planned to go live the week of September 16, 2019
- Received correspondence that municipal waterlines will be flushed the week of September 23, 2019
- Accepted the Request for Proposal submitted by Swantech Energy Solutions Inc. for new arena surface lighting
- Council discussed with staff the current water loss in the system and the fluctuating flow summary presented by LAWSS for 2019.
- Authorized LAWSS to explore the possibility of filling the Alvinston Standpipe directly and bypassing the pumping station/reservoir at an approximate cost of \$8,000
- Reviewed the staff report on eliminating single use plastics such as election signs and strategies to encourage politicians to be mindful of environmental issues and placement during the election campaigns
- Directed staff to pursue cost estimates for recreational facility interior designers for cosmetic input into the modernizing of the BAICCC including the auditorium, upper hall and meeting rooms (lighting, paint, furnishing, floor covers) and once completed provide the full report to Council for review and direction;
- Council provided direction on securing grant writing assistance to assist with funding opportunities to assist with applicable rehabilitation and infrastructure projects.
- Adopted the By-law to approve the sale of the Town shop
- Directed staff to look into regulations for distances of personal cannabis plants and neighbouring properties
- Requested staff to arrange a meeting between Council and the Optimist Building Committee
- Reviewed the report on active property standards files in the Municipality
- Approved staffing, employee progressions and the advertising of a Part Time employee for the Parks & Recreation Department
- Directed staff to advise the Inwood Firemen's Association that the proposed lease was not accepted and requested that the IFA consider a one year lease for exclusive use of the new bay to allow Brooke Fire Rescue to maintain a presence in Inwood while the committee explores other options which may include a municipally owned fire station.
