### Restricted Highway shall mean:

- (a) those Highways described in Schedule "A" under the heading "Restricted Highways";
- (b) Highways under the jurisdiction of the Province of Ontario;
- Permitted Off-road Vehicles shall be permitted on all Highways in the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston, except for Restricted Highways, from one-half hour after sunrise to one-half hour before sunset. No Off-Road Vehicle shall be permitted on Restricted Highways at any time, save for crossing Restricted Highways permitted by Ontario Regulation 316/03, Operation of Off-road Vehicles Highways, under the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter H.8. S

# 3. PROHIBITIONS FOR OFF-ROAD VEHICLES

- The authority to drive an off-road vehicle on highways under the jurisdiction of the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston does not include:
- any sidewalk, footpath or other area meant solely for pedestrian traffic;  $\equiv$
- any lands within a municipal park, trail, and cemeteries;  $\equiv$
- private roads or driveways without the consent of the owner thereof;  $\equiv$
- any highway falling under the jurisdiction of the Province of Ontario or any other government authority; <u>(</u>

- (vi) unopened road allowances.

### 8. INSURANCE

### 9. DRIVER'S LICENCE CONDITIONS

- The driver of the off-road vehicle shall hold a valid Class A, B, C, D, E, F, G, G2, M or M2 driver's LICENCE issued under the Act unless he or she is exempt, under section 34 of the Act, from the application of section 32 of the Act. O. Reg. 135/15, s.6. 9.1

#### 10. HELMET

The driver of the off-road vehicle and every passenger on the vehicle shall wear O. Reg. a helmet that complies with section 19 of the Off-Road Vehicles Act.

No person shall drive an off-road vehicle on a highway with a passenger on the vehicle unless the passenger is wearing a helmet as required by subsection (1) O. Reg. 135/15, s.6.

#### 11. SEATBELTS

### Restricted Highways

Those highways specified in the Municipal Official Plan that are located in the following areas are restricted from Off Road Vehicles:

Residential

Commercial

Open Space

Industrial

Mixed Industrial / Commercial
