Re: Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and the Acton Drain

In accordance with your instructions, I have undertaken a preliminary examination of the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and the Acton Drain in the N1/4 Lot 9, Concession 13 in the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston. The course of the work has been surveyed and a Plan prepared.

Authorization under the Drainage Act

This Engineers Report that has been prepared under Section 78 of the Drainage Act as per the request of an affected Landowner.

Under Section 78 of the Drainage Act, Council may undertake and complete the maintenance or repair of any drainage works constructed under a bylaw passed under this Act or its predecessor. Section 78 is to be used where it is considered expedient to change the course of the drainage works, or to make a new outlet for the whole or any part of the drainage works, or to construct a tile drain under the bed of the whole or any part of the drainage works as ancillary thereto, or to construct, reconstruct or extend embankments, walls, dykes, dams, reservoirs, bridges, pumping stations, or other protective works as ancillary to the drainage works, or to otherwise improve, extend to an outlet or alter the drainage works or to cover the whole or any part of it, or to consolidate two or more drainage works, the Council whose duty it is to maintain and repair the drainage works or any part thereof may, without a petition required under Section 4 but on the report of an Engineer appointed by it, undertake and complete the drainage works as set forth in such report.

Existing Conditions

The Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 consists of two covered drains each consisting of 300 mm dia. concrete tile. The original covered drain consisting of 200 mm dia. concrete tile, which was abandoned, is apparently still in working condition. The north 300 mm

dia. tile was constructed under and Engineer's Report dated October 20, 2006. It included a 600 x 600 mm offset catchbasin on both sides of Little Ireland Road. The south 300 mm dia. tile was constructed under an Engineer's Report dated April 10, 2018 and included a 900 x 1200 mm catchbasin on the east side of Little Ireland Road. The catchbasins are interconnected on the east side of the road. Both drains extend from an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain east to the east side of Little Ireland Road.

The Acton Drain consists of two covered drains. The original covered drain consisting of 300 mm dia. concrete tile, which was abandoned, is apparently still in working condition. The north 300 mm dia. tile was constructed under and Engineer's Report dated October 20, 2006. It included a 600 x 600 mm offset catchbasin on both sides of Little Ireland Road. The south 400 mm dia. tile was constructed under an Engineer's Report dated April 10, 2018 and included a 900 x 1200 mm catchbasin on the east side of Little Ireland Road. The catchbasins are interconnected on the east side of the road. Both drains extend from an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain east to the east side of Little Ireland Road.

Drain Classification

The Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and the Acton Drain are both currently classified as a class "F" drains throughout their length. The Parker Lucas Drain downstream is currently classified as a class "F" drain. Class "F" drains are intermittent or ephemeral (dry for more than two consecutive months). Authorization is not required if work is done in the dry or during periods of low flows.

Drainage Area Investigation

A petition for Drainage Works under section 4 of the Drainage Act was received from the Owner of the N1/4 Lot 9, Concession 13. The Owner is concerned with the amount of water flow from lands located east of Little Ireland Road.

An onsite meeting was held on September 27, 2021. The Owner of lands west of Little Ireland Road is concerned with erosion due to the large amount of water flow from upstream lands. Discussion included a possible cutoff drain on the east side of Little Ireland Road outletting to the Parker Lucas Drain to the north or a possible cutoff drain along the east side of roll no. 40-160 outletting north to the Parker Lucas Drain. It was decided to survey the drainage areas of the Acton Drain and the Parker Lucas Drain and confirm the drainage area.

The traditional drainage area for the Acton Drain is comprised of 35.97 ha. of land and the traditional drainage area for the Parker Lucas Branch Drain is 6.5 ha. A topographic

survey was completed along with a check with LIDAR. The drainage area for the Acton Drain is now determined to be 38.37 ha and the drainage area for the Parker Lucas Branch Drain has increased to approx. 13.09 ha.

The Acton Drain and Parker Lucas Branch Drain were last improved under an Engineer's Report dated April 10, 2018. At this time a covered drain was constructed as part of the Parker Lucas Drain providing a minimum capacity of 37 mm per 24 hours in accordance with the Drainage Guide for Ontario, Publication 29. With the revised drainage areas, the capacity of both the Parker Lucas Branch Drain and the Acton Drain both still exceed the recommended drainage coefficient of 37 mm per 24 hours.

Berms have been constructed on the west side of the road allowance and an overflow pipe was constructed on the east side of Little Ireland Road to control the amount of surface water overflowing the road.

On Site Meeting

A public meeting was held on July 8, 2023 to discuss the findings regarding the drainage area. The following is a brief summary of the meeting:

Surface water generated on lands east of Little Ireland Road can overtop the road and sheet flow across the N1/4 Lot 9, Concession 13 to the open channel portion of the Parker Lucas drain causing erosion on downstream lands and damage to the travelled portion of the road allowance.

An option discussed at the meeting included a cutoff channel north from the Parker Lucas Branch Drain north along the east side of Little Ireland Road to the Parker Lucas Drain. The length is approx. 347 metres. The channel would be quite deep as the ground elevations increase to the north. Also, there are gas lines that will have to be crossed.

Another option discussed was a channel located further east directing surface water north to the Parker Lucas Drain. There is the same issue with the gas line.

Other options include restoring the original channel downstream from Little Ireland Road, constructing a grassed water way downstream of Little Ireland Road or building the road up to create a berm (the cost of road buildup would be part of the costs to the drainage works assessed to landowners).

Other Options were discussed.

Proposals

- 1. Construct a channel parallel to both the Parker Lucas Branch Drain and the Acton Drain to provide an outlet for surface waters along the natural flow path to the Parker Lucas Drain.
- 2. Construct a grassed water way over or in the vicinity of the existing Parker Lucas Branch Drain and the Acton Drain to provide an outlet for surface waters along the natural flow path to the Parker Lucas Drain.
- 3. Construct a channel along the west side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Branch Drain south to the south limit of the property with roll no. 40-159 thence west to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain, a distance of approx. 858 metres.
- 4. Construction of a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road north to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain, a distance of approx. 353 metres.
- 5. Construction of a channel along the east side of the property with roll no. 40-160 north to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain, a distance of approx. 339 metres.
- 6. Extend the covered drain upstream from Little Ireland Road from the existing Parker Lucas Branch Drain through the property with roll no. 40-123 that includes berms and surface water inlets, a distance of approx. 395 metres.
- 7. Extend the covered drain upstream from Little Ireland Road from the existing Acton Drain through the property with roll no. 40-123 that includes berms and surface water inlets, a distance of approx. 730 metres.

Rainfalls in the summer of 2024 have overflowed the road and caused extensive damage to the crop downstream. The natural fall is across Lot 9 (roll no. 40-122) west to the Parker Lucas Drain. The options of providing outlet through that property were further discussed with the Owners with further proposals put forth as follows:

- 8. Construct a channel on the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 south to the 12th Concession Drain Extension.
- 9. Construct a channel on the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 south to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9 thence west to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain.

10. Construct a channel on the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 north to the Parker Lucas Drain and construct a channel on the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Acton Drain south to either the 12th Concession Drain Extension or south and west along the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9 to the Parker Lucas Drain.

Discussion

Construction of a channel north to the Parker Lucas Drain will be difficult due to the required depth of the channel and due to the presence of gas pipelines which are shallow.

Extension of tile drains upstream from Little Ireland Road with berms and surface water inlets were not considered a viable option due to the slope of the land and amount of water flow.

Construction of a channel in 2 locations on the property would divide the farm as would grassed waterways.

Constructing a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road south from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 would require lawn culverts across the residential property. Constructing a channel on the west side of the road still requires the water to cross the road to the proposed channel

Recommendations

As discussed in the previous section, my opinion is that a channel is necessary to control the amount on surface water that flows to the existing municipal drains. It will be difficult to force the water to flow south then west from the natural slope of the land which is west.

- 1. Proposal No. 3 requires the surface water to be transported across Little Ireland Road in 2 locations
- 2. Proposal No. 8 includes the extension of a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road south from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 to the 12th Concession Drain Extension. It would necessitate a lawn culvert across the frontage of the existing residence. During the high water levels in the summer of 2024, there was extensive flooding in the area of the 12th Concession Drain Extension and Little Ireland Road. By diverting surface water from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and the Acton Drain to the 12th Concession Drain Extension, it is likely to increase the flooding in the area and potentially allow water flow from the 12th Concession Drain Extension to backflow to the

Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and Acton Drain causing increased flooding in that area.

- 3. Proposal No. 9 includes the extension of a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road south from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9 and thence west across Little Ireland Road to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain. The surface water would be maintained east of the road allowance with a road culvert under Little Ireland to the south. It would necessitate a lawn culvert across the frontage of the existing residence.
- 4. Proposal No. 10 includes the extension of a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 north to the Parker Lucas Drain and the extension of a channel from the Acton Drain south to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9 thence west across Little Ireland Road to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain. This option eliminates the lawn culvert. At issue are the gas line crossings to the north. They are reportedly very shallow and will require some sort of piping to cross, if it is possible to cross at all.

I would recommend that Proposal No. 9 be considered to address surface water concerns.

During periods of high rainfall events water will flow west through Lot 9 to the Parker Lucas Drain.

Estimate of Cost

An Estimate of Cost has been prepared for Proposals No. 1, 3, 8, 9 and 10 along with a preliminary Schedules of Assessment and Estimated Net Assessments

The Estimates of Cost allow for a channel with a minimum depth of 1.2 metres and a minimum bottom width of 1.2 metres to accommodate surface water. The existing covered drains shall remain to accommodate subsurface drainage.

The Estimate of Cost for Proposal No. 1 is approx. \$239,072.00 which includes a channel along the length of the existing Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 and the Acton Drain from Little Ireland Road through the N1/4 Lot 9 to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain..

The Estimate of Cost for Proposal No. 3 is approx. \$269,186.00 which includes a channel along the west side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 south to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9, concession 13 thence west to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain.

The Estimate of Cost for Proposal No. 8 is approx. \$409,810.00 which includes a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 south to an outlet to the 12th Concession Drain extension. This includes a lawn culvert across 4760 Little Ireland Road.

The Estimate of Cost for Proposal No. 9 is approx. \$340,526.00 which includes a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 south to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9, concession 13 thence west to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain. This includes a lawn culvert across 4760 Little Ireland Road.

The Estimate of Cost for Proposal No. 10 is approx. \$625,601.00 which includes a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Acton Drain south to the south limit of the N1/4 Lot 9, concession 13 thence west to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain and a channel along the east side of Little Ireland Road from the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 north to an outlet to the Parker Lucas Drain.

• An allowance has been made to cross under the Gas Line with 900 mm dia. HDPE pipe by open cut assuming the existing Gas Line is shallow to allow the pipe to pass beneath and permission is received by the owner of the Gas Line.

Depths of a channel extending south to the 12th Concession Drain range from 1.2 metres to 2.62 metres. Depths of a channel extending north to the Parker Lucas Drain range from 1.2 metres to 2.82 metres

Assessment

As per Section 21 of the Drainage Act, the Engineer in his report shall assess for benefit and outlet for each parcel of land and road liable for assessment.

Lands, roads, buildings, utilities, or other structures that are increased in value or are more easily maintained as a result of the construction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of a drainage works may be assessed for benefit. (Section 22)

Lands and roads that use a drainage works as an outlet, or for which, when the drainage works is constructed or improved, an improved outlet is provided either directly or indirectly through the medium of any other drainage works or of a swale, ravine, creek, or watercourse may be assessed for outlet. The assessment for outlet shall be based on the volume and rate of flow of the water artificially caused to flow into the drainage works from the lands and roads liable for such assessments. (Section 23)

The Engineer may assess for special benefit any lands for which special benefits have been provided by the drainage works. (Section 24)

A Schedule of Assessment for the lands and roads affected by the work and therefore liable for the cost thereof will be prepared as per the Drainage Act. Also, assessments may be made against any public utility or road authority, as per Section 26 of the Drainage Act, for any increased cost for the removal or relocation of any of its facilities and plant that may be necessitated by the construction or maintenance of the drainage works. Items to be assessed under Section 26 shall be tendered separately with the actual cost plus a portion of the engineering (25% of the cost).

The cost of any approvals, permits or any extra work, beyond that specified in this report that is required by any utility, conservation authority, government ministry or organization (federal or provincial), or road authority shall be assessed to that organization requiring the permit, approval, or extra work.

The estimated cost of the drainage works would generally be assessed in the following manner:

- 1. The channel construction was divided into sections. A portion of the cost was assessed as either cutoff benefit or direct benefit to the N1/4 Lot 9, Concession 13.
- 2. The estimated cost for the portion of channel along Little Ireland is assessed with 10% of the cost assessed to the Road Authority.
- 3. The estimated cost for the road crossings have been assessed as a special benefit to the Road Authority.
- 4. The remainder of the estimated cost was assessed to upstream properties as outlet assessment, either the Parker Lucas Drain Branch No. 1 or the Acton Drain.

Allowances

Under Section 29 of the Drainage Act, the Engineer in his report shall estimate and allow in money to the Owner of any land that it is necessary to use for the construction or improvement of a drainage works or for the disposal of material removed from drainage works. This shall be considered an allowance for right of way. There is an existing right of way and as such no allowances have not been made under Section 29 of this report.

Under Section 30 of the Drainage Act, the Engineer shall determine the amount to be paid to persons entitled thereto for damage, if any, to ornamental trees, lawns, fences, land and crops occasioned by the disposal of material removed from a drainage works. This shall be considered an allowance for damages.

Allowances have been made, where appropriate, as per Section 29 and Section 30 of the Drainage Act for damages to lands and crops. Allowances for right of way under Section 29 are based on \$50,000.00 (\$20,000.00/acre). Allowances for damages to lands and crops under Section 30 are based on \$2,000.00 per hectare for the first year and \$1,000.00 for the second year (\$3,000.00 per hectare total).

Section 29 allowances will apply for the lands occupied by the proposed channel. Section 30 allowances will apply to lands used to dispose of the excavated material.

Access and Working Area

Access for the work shall be from Little Ireland Road. The working areas for the construction of the proposed channels shall be designated in any final Report. The width shall vary depending on the depth of the channel.

Restrictions

No trees and shrubs shall be planted nor shall permanent structures be erected within the working area of either side of the drain without prior written permission of Council.

Attention is also drawn to sections 80 and 82 of the Drainage Act, which refer to the removal of obstructions in a drain and damage caused to a drain.

Agricultural Grant

It would be recommended that application for subsidy be made for eligible agricultural properties. Any assessments against non-agricultural properties would be shown separately in the Schedule of Assessment.

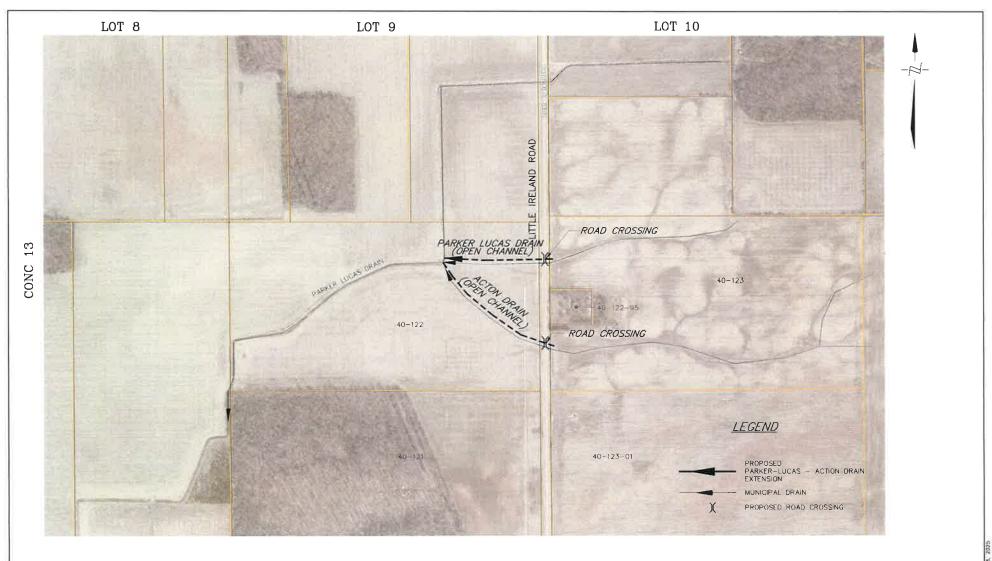
Maintenance

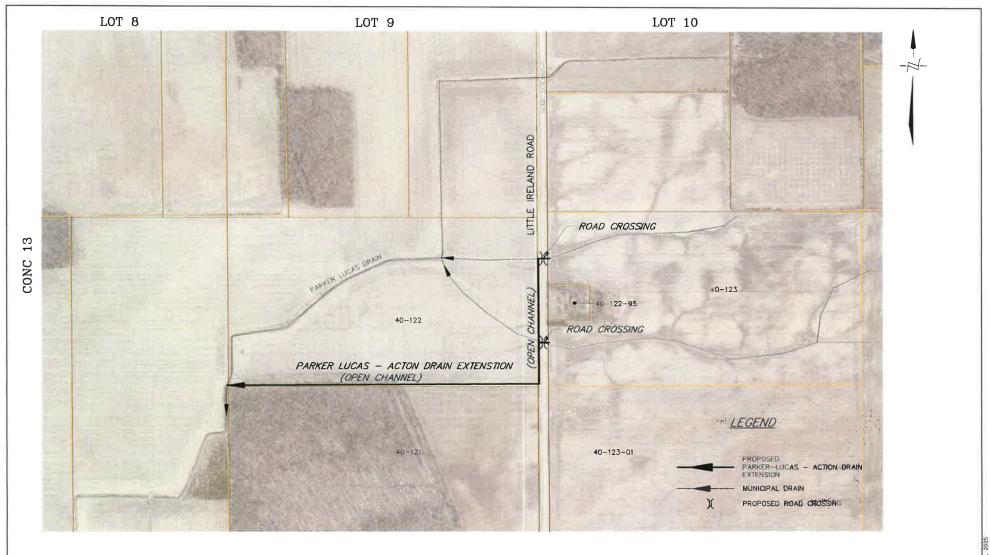

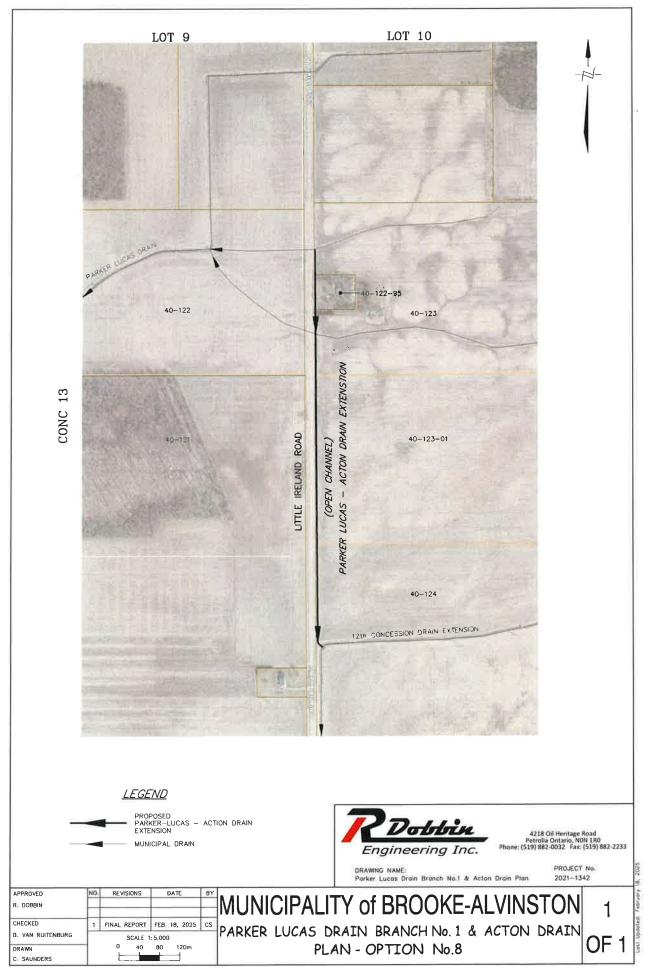

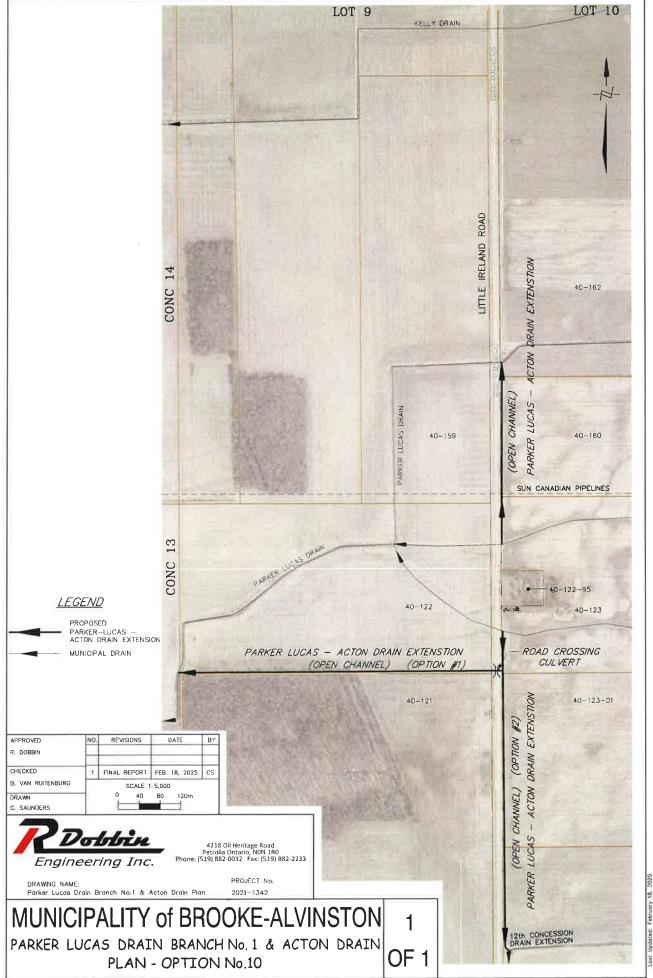

This problem has been addressed on more than one occasion. An Engineer's report was done in 2006 and again in 2018 and both reports were acted on by installing drainage tile and creating berms.

All the proposals put forth in this report except Proposal # 2 are too costly to the properties upstream with no benefit, to those properties. There will probably always be storms that will exceed the water capacity of any structure you build including the ones in this report.

Proposal #2 States: Construct a grass water way over, or in the vicinity, of the existing Parker Lucas Branch Drain and the Acton Drain to provide an outlet for surface waters along the natural flow path to the Parker Lucas Drain.

We believe that grass waterways work well to control erosion and still can be farmed over.

If the owner of Lot 9 would like to progress with any of the other proposals for their land improvements, at their own expense, we will give them access to our property E1/2W1/2 L11 farm.

We will only support the grass seeding of Proposal #2 with the approval of the upstream landowners. We will not support any other proposal in this report.

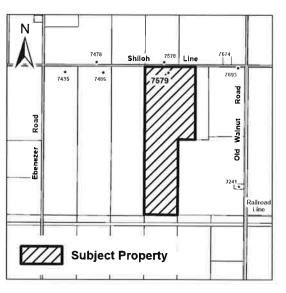

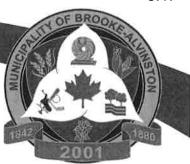

Recommendation:

That Council consider improvements at the Memorial Garden and the replacement of memorial name plaques.

Background:

At the Nov 14, 2024 council meeting, and most recently at the March 13, 2025 meeting, Council had requested a report on the memorial name plaques and some improvements towards the garden.

A report was provided on March 27th with direction for more information.

Comments:

Plaques:

Currently there are 24 memorial name plaques located within the gardens.

We are compiling a list of names and will attempt to contact the families to inquire about new replacement plaques.

We have obtained pricing on different plaque design: New plaque holders at \$1,200 New (Aluminum) plaques at \$7,650 with a lifetime guarantee Plastic (current) at \$1125

Total cost: \$355 / (aluminum plaque) or \$45 (plastic plaque) PLUS holder costs (\$50) Should Council have a preference on the type of plaque (plastic or aluminum) we will pursue the replacements.

The plaques should be the responsibility of the family to purchase and not the municipality. This upgrade will be on a cost recovery basis aside from staff time to install.

Tree removal:

Summit trees were in to do some estimates and mark trees. Property ownership of the trees is being investigated through surveys and unofficially it does appear that most trees are <u>not</u> on municipal property. We have identified one municipal tree and will arrange for it to be removed at the estimated cost of \$1,200 + HST.

We will coordinate the tree removal shortly.

Financial Considerations:

Work to the Memorial Gardens (tree removal) will come from the Parks & Recreation budget.

Recommendation:

That Council receive and file the report on the Alvinston Killer Bees Hockey Club (AKB) contribution.

Background:

After a record setting season, the AKB have been eliminated from the playoffs losing out to the Strathroy Jets in 6 games. Last year the organization approached the municipality requesting to keep the ice in for an additional month for their playoff run. Again this year, the ice was booked to stay in until the end of April.

Comments:

With the departure from the playoffs, the AKB's have graciously decided to pay for 13.5 hrs of ice that they would have used throughout the finals in a good faith contribution to the municipality. Over the course of the ice season, the AKB averaged approximately 7.5hrs of ice over each 2 week period, also renting the meeting room once a month for board meetings. Each home game also saw them rent the auditorium at full rate, creating an electric atmosphere for BAICCC.

The AKB's have additionally supported many fundraising events in the community through their 50/50 raffles and fundraisers.

In 2026 we will plan to maintain ice to (or around) April 15th with flexibility should the playoff season run longer.

Recommendation:

That Council approve the \$2 / square foot fee for the Ale House patio in addition to the \$250 lease / application fee (total fee of \$750 / year) and enter into an agreement as drafted for a three year term.

Background:

The agreement to permit the Ale House patio onto River Street expired in 2024 and the owners would like to renew the agreement again. At the March 27th meeting, staff were advised to report back to Council on comparable fees, and business comments since the landscape of businesses on River Street has changed since the Patio first went up.

Comments:

Local municipal offices were contacted to inquire about their practices:

Fees:

A poll of area Municipalities with fees was taken. The Lambton County municipalities with patios shouldn't be compared similarily as these patios are on the sidewalks and for the most part leave the 1.5m access for pedestrian traffic and are not within a municipal road enclosure. Fees for these sidewalk patios with unobstructed sidewalks and parking ranged from

- \$0 / year;
- \$103/year + application fee (\$50) and
- fees based on square footage (\$10 / ft2)

A sampling of costs were obtained from municipalities that have patios similar to the Ale House that encompass parking areas. These fees ranged from:

- a flat minimum rate (\$500 / year)
- \$10 / parking space / day
- \$2 square footage fee with \$300 application fee.

Fee Consideration

- 1) \$750 flat fee (discussed at March 27th meeting; includes \$250 application / license fee)
- 2) The Ale House patio takes up *approximately* 2 parking spaces (18 x 7) which is 252 square feet. If a \$2 / ft2 fee is attached the annual fee would be \$504 + application / license fee).

Insurance:

I recently met with our insurance representative and he noted that at minimum, we should ensure \$5M in liability insurance from the Ale House. The attached agreement was reviewed and comments from the Provider were included.

Business Owners:

I spoke / emailed all River Street Business Owners if they had any concerns with the Ale House Patio going up and taking up *approximately* 2 parking spaces.

- 1 likes the concept, not the loss of parking
- 3 had no comments or concerns

A draft agreement is proposed for adoption by Council should Council approve of the placement of the patio.

Financial Considerations:

The current patio licensing fee is \$250 in accordance with the by-law. This fee has been considered a lease / application fee / year.

At the March 27th meeting, Council approved a fee of \$750 / year. Taking into account the proposed \$2/ft2 fee (\$504) plus the application fee of \$250, the \$750 fee is appropriate for the size of the patio and accounts for administrative time. This fee is also comparable to other municipalities with similar patio builds.

It works out to roughly \$3.75 / day for the Ale House to conduct business on municipal property.

AGREEMENT FOR A SIDEWALK LEASE AGREEMENT 3225 / 3227 River Street

This agreement made this _____ day of _____, 2025

Between Jamie & Vickie Armstrong (Armor's Ale House) (hereinafter referred to as the 'Lessee')

And THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF BROOKE-ALVINSTON (hereinafter referred to as the 'Municipality')

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, as amended, provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under this or any other Act;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, as amended, provides that Section 8 shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on municipalities to enable them to govern their affairs as they consider appropriate and to enhance their ability to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS the Lessee is the owner of lands identified as 3225 /3227 River Street., hereafter referred to as the 'Owners Lands', and more particularly described as: Armor's Ale House;

AND WHEREAS the Municipality wishes to enter into a Sidewalk Lease Agreement with Armor's Ale House respecting the use of a portion of the sidewalk/road allowance/boulevard in proximity to 3225 / 3227 River Street, Alvinston, ON;

NOW THEREFORE the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The leased area shall be used on a seasonal basis during the period commencing April 15th to October 31st, inclusive.
- 2. The term of this agreement shall be:

April 15, 2025-October 31, 2025 April 15, 2026-October 31, 2026 April 15, 2027-October 31, 2027

- 3. At all times when the patio is not in operation during the period November 1st to March 31st, inclusive, the sidewalk is required to be cleared so that snow removal operations are not impeded in any way.
- 4. The fullest possible free and clear pedestrian movement shall be provided.
- 5. AODA requirements for patios (outlined in Appendix A to this agreement) shall be followed. The patio may be subject to inspections for compliance.
- 6. The establishment shall not be conducted in a noisy manner such as to interfere with other businesses or obstruct pedestrians, and shall be subject to closure daily at 1 a.m.
- 7. The lessee shall abide by all provisions of the Smoke Free Ontario Act
- 8. Reflective markings shall be adhered to the outside of the patio walls for visibility
- 9. Where the proposed use of the leased sidewalk is for a licensed patio / café, the regulations prescribed by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario shall be adhered to unless otherwise stipulated by Council. The revocation of any

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sidewalk patio lease agreement shall be enforced after any breach of the liquor laws of Ontario.

10. All Risks Property Insurance

All risks (including sewer damage, flood and earthquake) property insurance in an amount equal to the full replacement cost of property of every description and kind owned by the Tenant or for which the Tenant is legally responsible, and which is located on or about the Demised Premises, including, without limitation, anything in the nature of a leasehold improvement;

Commercial General Liability Insurance

The Lessee shall, at their expense obtain and keep in force during the term of the Lease, Commercial General Liability Insurance satisfactory to the Municipality and underwritten by an insurer licensed to conduct business in the Province of Ontario. The policy shall provide coverage for Bodily Injury, Property Damage and Personal Injury and shall include but not be limited to:

- A limit of liability of not less than \$ 5 million/occurrence with an aggregate of not less than \$5 Million
- Add the Municipality as an additional insured with respect to the operations of the Named Insured
- The policy shall contain a provision for cross liability and severability of interest in respect of the Named Insured
- Non-owned automobile coverage with a limit not less than \$5 Million and shall include contractual non-owned coverage (SEF 96)
- Products and completed operations coverage
- Broad Form Property Damage
- Contractual Liability
- Hostile fire
- The policy shall provide 30 days prior notice of cancellation
- 11. The Lessee shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents from and against any and all claims of any nature, actions, causes of action, losses, expenses, fines, costs (including legal costs), interest or damages of every nature and kind whatsoever, including but not limited to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death or to damage to or destruction of tangible property including loss of revenue or incurred expense resulting from disruption of service, arising out of or allegedly attributable to the negligence, acts, errors, omissions, misfeasance, nonfeasance, fraud or willful misconduct of the Lessee, its directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors, or any of them, in connection with or in any way related to the delivery or performance of this Contract. This indemnity shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any insurance to be provided by the Lessee in accordance with this Agreement and shall survive this Agreement.
- 12. The Lessee agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston from and against any and all claims of any nature, actions, causes of action, losses, expenses, fines, costs (including legal costs), interest or damages of every nature and kind whatsoever arising out of or related to the Lessee's status with WSIB. This indemnity shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any proof of WSIB status and compliance to be provided by the Lessee in accordance with this Agreement, and shall survive this Agreement.
- 13. Any construction work that is undertaken shall be in accordance with the Ontario Building Code and a Building Permit may be obtained if required. Any leasehold improvements permitted in the approved plan shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Municipality and shall be maintained by

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- the Lessee at the Owner's sole risk and expense to the satisfaction of the Municipality.
- 14. The Municipality shall be granted the power to terminate the lease within fifteen (15) days written notice should the property be required for municipal purposes upon reasonable grounds or if the lessee fails to comply with the terms of the lease.
- 15. In the event of a default by the Lessee or its assigns in the provision or maintenance of any of the matters and things required to be done by the Lessee pursuant to this Agreement, the municipality may, at the expense of the Lessee, send a notice in writing to the Lessee which notice shall specify the default and the requirements to rectify such default. If the Lessee has not completed the rectification of any such default or has failed to take, in the opinion of the Corporation, sufficient action to do so within twenty-one (21) days of receiving such notice, then the Municipality may, at the expense of the Lessee, enter upon the lands and do all such matters and things as are in default. Any cost incurred by the Municipality shall be paid by the Lessee to the Municipality within thirty (30) days of the mailing of an invoice by the Municipality addressed to the then current owner of the Lessee lands as shown in the last revised assessment roll of the Municipality. In default of payment, such an amount referred to in this clause may be recovered by the Corporation in a like manner as taxes charge to the Owner's Lands pursuant to the provision of Section 427 of the Municipal Act, RSO, 2001 as amended.
- 16. The lessee agrees to pay \$750 yearly for the term of this lease agreement.
- 17. The lessee shall have the option to extend the term of this agreement for a period of three years upon delivery of written notice to the Municipality not later than the 30th day prior to the expiry of this agreement provided that the Municipality has not served notice on the lessee that the land will be required for municipal purposes. The terms and conditions of this agreement shall continue to apply during the extension and with approval of Council.
- 18. Tables, chairs and decorative accessories on patios that are used for the active selling of food or drink shall be placed a minimum distance of one meter from the curb line and ten centimeters from abutting properties.
- 19. The use of rain screens/curtains shall be in accordance with the following conditions:
- a) the material shall be clear plastic or mesh screening only; no rigid materials shall be permitted;
- b) rain screens/curtains shall only be permitted during rainy periods;
- c) the period of operation shall be April 15 to October 31of each year;
- d) umbrellas are excluded from this provision,
- 20. The lessee agrees not to encumber the sidewalk surrounding the leased area in any way and specifically not to permit the placement of "sandwich board" signs, planters or extraneous advertising objects on the sidewalk or to allow bicycles to be affixed to or leaned against the sidewalk patio fence.
- 21. The planting of annuals, vines and container growth is encouraged and shall be removed at the end of the approved seasonal use period.
- 22. The lessee agrees to maintain the patio fence, especially the top rail, as well as the top surface of the curb along the widened sidewalk around the patio so as to provide greater visibility.
- 23. No patio operator shall fail to maintain the sidewalk leased as a patio and it shall be an offence to fail to clean the sidewalk required for the patio.

Appendix A To By-law xx of 2025

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Accessible Outdoor Public Use Eating Areas

Under the <u>Design of Public Spaces Standard</u> of the <u>AODA</u>, cities and other organizations building or redeveloping outdoor public use eating areas must make those areas accessible to visitors with disabilities. Rules for accessible outdoor public use eating areas apply to <u>private organizations with fifty or more workers</u> and to all public sector organizations.

Accessible Outdoor Public Use Eating Areas

Outdoor public use eating areas include picnic grounds and outdoor tables in public parks, hospitals, and universities. Outdoor food courts in resorts and amusement parks also need to be accessible. Organizations that build outdoor eating areas for public use must make at least twenty percent of their tables accessible. Furthermore, organizations with nine or fewer tables must make at least one table accessible.

Minimum Requirements for Accessible Tables

The ground surface on the way to accessible tables must be firm and stable so that canes, crutches, or the wheels of mobility devices will not sink into it. Surfaces must also be level, without slopes. The same rules apply to the ground surface under accessible tables. Moreover, there must be room around tables for visitors using mobility devices to travel forward to their tables, instead of having to approach them without facing them. In addition, tables must have knee and toe clearance so that visitors using mobility devices such as wheelchairs or scooters can sit comfortably at the tables.

Recommendation:

That the Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston participate in the joint RFP for internet voting with other Lambton County Municipalities for the 2026 municipal election; and that once the results are in, a further report be brought to Council for consideration and determination of which alternate voting method should be used.

Background:

The next municipal and school board election will be Monday, October 26, 2026.

The Municipality of Brooke-Alvinston has underwent its fifth straight municipal election using the vote by mail method. These elections have run smoothly in part and partnership with Datafix - a company we contract with. Our voter turnout has also been one of the higher in Lambton County with an average of 51.5% over the 5 years.

Comments:

Lambton County municipalities generally work closely together during the election period (and year round) in preparing for the municipal election. There has been discussion on alternative voting methods amongst the Lambton County Clerks and what options to present to their respective Councils. Notably, there is an increased interest in internet voting.

The Clerks, as such are collectively submitting a joint Request for Proposal (RFP) for consultants to quote pricing to operate with this method. The City of Sarnia is preparing the joint RFP and the designing of the RFP is currently underway. If Council has any interest in internet voting, it would be prudent to join the RFP process. Many vendors that offer electronic voting methods place a cap on the number of municipal clients they support during an election to ensure effective and efficient customer service, which is why we are beginning the RFP process in spring 2025.

Brooke-Alvinston could be included as optional in the RFP. The vendors price all municipalities individually, and then each municipality enters into a separate agreement with the vendor. The beauty of the joint RFP is that we all have the same vendor, so the look and feel of the system is the same across the county and all of us can have the same procedures.

Once the RFP has closed and the bids have been disclosed, the Municipality would still have the opportunity to reconsider methods. Section 42(2)(a) of the Municipal Elections Act provides a deadline of May 1 of the election year (2026) to pass a bylaw for alternative voting methods.
